



Experience & lessons learned process – Indonesia:

The Global Fund funding request allocation period, Window 1 (2023-2025)

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Overview of the GC7 community engagement process

- ▶ The International Network of People who Use Drugs (INPUD) which is one of the partners of the Global Fund Community, Rights and Gender Strategic Initiatives (CRG-SI) in delivering long-term technical assistance to drug user-led networks and organization. Through PKNI, INPUD provide technical assistance to support their engagement in the funding request process.
- ▶ PKNI's commitment to be a focal point for INPUD TA support to Indonesia was delivered formally through a letter to the Secretariat CCM Indonesia and Technical Working Group which immediately received a positive Response and allowed PKNI to be engaged and also gave the space to participate and contribute in the development of funding Request Proposal Global Fund Indonesia.


Technical support

- With the assistance and financial support from INPUD, we gained more confidence and were able to have stronger arguments.
- Capacity Building and Mentoring allows us to be aware of the latest documents and we become more familiar with the technical process of Submitting a Country Proposal.
- ► Technical support is really helpful in early orientation, and helps to analyze and give solution if there are difficulties regarding the actions to be performed






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Take the floor ,critically and be persistent enough so they will consider our concerns.

- Our first step is to present the available factual evidence related to the prioritized issues/ Essential programs of the PUD.
- Participate actively, attend key strategic meetings, including Community priority annex, attend all TWG meetings as a representative of PKNI GF GC 7 Team and to ensure a people centered and integrated healthcare approach.
- ► Ensure pwud/pwid priorities are included in the 20 priorities to be submitted in the Community Priority Annex
- These Priority annex meeting consultations will include a wider range of organizations, not just PKNI members.

Key challenges & how did we manage to overcome those?


- Stigmatized drug users and trust issues creates barriers to their meaningful participation
- There is still a long way to go for drug user representatives to be fully valued as experts in the Global Fund
- The challenge is also due to complexity of the GF technical documents, it takes time to understand some documents that must be learned.
- Our recommendations should have a reference base

Key successes & recommendations

- Meaningful involvement of community-led organizations
- Be brave enough to tell the truth based on facts
- People who use drugs are experts on needs for and barriers to HIV services, and should be meaningfully engaged in planning, delivery, monitoring and evaluation of harm reduction services.
- Interventions that engage people living with HIV and other key populations including addressing human rights-related barriers to accessing health services
- Align recomendation with reference to WHO guidelines and other relevant documents
- Have knowledge and understanding of reference document such as : HIV information note, CSS technical brief, gender equity technical brief, harm reduction for people who use drugs technical brief, HIV programming at scale for and with key population technical brief, removing human rights-barrier to HIV services technical brief, IDUIT, WHO consolidated guidelines for key populations 2022, world drug report 2022 (UNODC), global state of harm reduction 2022 (harm reduction international

PKNI achievements on Proposal Funding Request Global Fund Indonesia

- First Kick Off Community Meeting PKNI was selected to be the chair in the class
- A number of PKNI recommendations became part of the list of activities in the HIV prevention module (communication, information and demand creation for PUD)
- ▶ The country adopted a harm reduction approach to all interventions for PWID, not abstinence-based
- Needle syringe distribution through outreach workers including for daily users; availability of needles and syringes at Community Health Centre and SSR CSOs; Used syringes will be collected by SSRs and returned to DHO for disposal
- NSP Programs for PWID Distribution of an average of 250 needles and syringes/person/year
- PKNI also added a note into the proposal to include findings of the rapid review of the needle syringe programme. Survey inputs were provided to the Ministry of health on the specification of needles to procure in the country
- ▶ Ensure that competence training is inclusive for all PUD from varying backgrounds as peer workers may need to also involve people who are still actively using drugs to ensure relevance and updated knowledge of drug use on community empowerment for PUD intervention
- Verbal commitment from UNAIDS to support PKNI to develop a needs assessment related for naloxone to ensure its procurement in the country.
