- Drive programme quality based on the adoption of global guidance and sharing of best practice



Job Description

The role is responsible for:

- Coordinate development, implementation, and oversight of the workplans in Nigeria, Tanzania and Kyrgyzstan.
- Coordinate development, implementation, and oversight of national engagement plans in Nigeria, Tanzania and Kyrgyzstan.
- Ensure financial and fiscal oversight of the project as budget holder.
- Develop work plans, with the direction of the Executive Director, reports and other relevant documents that meet donor and internal requirements.
- Ensure project deliverables, including programmatic and financial reporting, are met.
- Maintain existing donor relationships and relationships with INPUD's partners and develop and establish new contacts and relationships relevant to INPUD's mission and foci.
- Provide technical assistance or link up to the appropriate person to regional and national networks so that they can meet project objectives and deliverables.
- Develop or supervise the development of technical and advocacy resources, documents and publications.
- Represent INPUD at appropriate meetings, workshops, etc.
- Attend weekly Secretariat meetings and Bi-Monthly check-ins with the line manager.
- Organise online peer technical support hubs.
- Mobilise Global Gund CE- SI short-term technical support for global drug user-led networks.
